The Christ University in Pacific was formerly known as Lavengamalie Christian University, established in 2004. It has been indeed a long way for institution to prepare itself for accreditation. The site was conducted from 25-29 June, 2018 to verify the institutions documentations including implementation of the research criteria for university registration. The institution has a unique characteristics in its programmes where it strongly values Christian qualities in this era of technology.





The institution is located on Maseia Plaza and is fully furnished with classrooms, lecturer's rooms, computer labs for undergraduates and post graduates and research center.



The site visit also included verification of information for Bachelor of Computer Information System and Master of Forensic Information Technology. The institution is strongly advocated for by its supporters from the Tokaikolo fellowship in Tonga and overseas. Moreover, local stakeholders support the training to be beneficial to the country as a whole.



The institution has the potential to exploit a niche in forensic investigation in Tonga and the positive comments from the Deputy Commissioner of Police about its programmes of studies. The outcome of the accreditation will be confirmed within the next two months.

2011 Tokyo Convention—Recognition of Qualification in Higher Education

Mr Claude Tupou- Director of Education and Training, Rev. Dr Mele'ana Puloka-President of Free Wesleyan Church Education and Mr Soane Vahe-Director of Catholic Education system in Tonga met the Acting CEO of TNQAB to discuss the document approved from the 2011 Tokyo convention on the recognition of qualification for higher institutions.

The meeting brought to light the need to focus on local needs first. This included recognition of skills and knowledge possessed by locals who did not have any formal certification. Moreover, the meeting members agreed that the current process employed by TNQAB for the recognition of foreign qualification was sufficient for now. There should also be consideration for the risks involved before binding to this convention to avoid any complaints and problems in future. The consultation is ongoing and will include Heads of higher institutions and relevant stakeholders.

TNQAB Board member, Mr Siaosi Pohiva officiated the TNQAB retreat on 20th June 2018 at Tungi Colonade Conference room. The purpose was to inform providers of the activities planned for the year 2018/19.
